Fundamental rights of victims contained in the Charter

- human dignity (Article 1)
- right to life (Article 2)
- right to the integrity of the person (Article 3)
- prohibition of slavery and forced labour (Article 5)
- right to liberty and security (Article 6)
- respect for private and family life (Article 7)
- protection of personal data (Article 8)
- freedom of expression and information (Article 11)
- right to property (Article 17)
- right to asylum (Article 18)
- protection in the event of removal, expulsion or extradition (Article 19)
- equality before the law (Article 20)
- non-discrimination (Article 21)
- cultural, religious and linguistic diversity (Article 22)
- equality between women and men (Article 23)
- the rights of the child (Article 24)
- the rights of the elderly (Article 25)
- integration of persons with disabilities (Article 26)
- healthcare (Article 35)
- freedom of movement and of residence (Article 45)
- diplomatic and consular protection (Article 46)
- right to an effective remedy and to fair trial (Article 47)

Scope of application of the Charter

The provisions of the Charter are addressed to the institutions, bodies, offices and agencies of the Union *only when they are implementing Union law.* (Article 51)
